- SAFETEA-LU reauthorization
 - Over 36 Capital Hill visits-to date in 2011
 - ARTBA Fly-in, May 23-25, 2011
- Update as of October 27
 - House Bill (Transportation and Infrastructure)
 - Senate Bill (Environmental & Public Works)
 - Senate Bill S.1193 "Federal-Aid Highway
 Preservation and Renewal Program Act of 2011"



2011 Priorities

- SAFETEA-LU reauthorization
 - Expires March 31, 2012
- Update as of October 27
 - House Bill (Transportation and Infrastructure Comm.)
 - 6 year bill/\$10+ B yearly shortfall at current spending levels
 - Rep. Mica (R-FL) insists on a 6 year bill, cutting FHWA programs significantly, performance standards, and \$\$ for transit
 - Speaker has given Mica go-ahead to pursue bill and he will provide the shortfall with "offsets"
 - No bill at this point, probably introduced in the spring of 2012

2011 Priorities

- Senate Bill (Environmental & Public Works)
 - MAP-21,(Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st
 Century) 2 year bill/funded at current levels
 - \$10B shortfall at current funding levels
 - Senate Finance Chairman Baucus & EPW Chairwoman Boxer announced mark-up of bill 11/9/11. Biparticipation effort with Inhofe & Vitter
 - Senate Bill S.1193 "Federal-Aid Highway
 Preservation and Renewal Program Act of 2011",

What's Going to Happen?

- Issue is \$\$\$\$ and where it is going to come from
- FP2 is committed to stay engaged in the effort
