# Local Agency Pavement Preservation Councils







### Purpose of Councils

- Support education and advance outreach assistance to local agencies for pavement preservation and asset management.
- Provide a <u>neutral</u> and productive environment for pavement preservation and asset management education



### Council Members

- Contractors, Suppliers, Consultants, Local Government Officials, and Academia
- Initial Funding from Industry Members



### Education Process

- All training coordinated through NCPP
- Classes conducted at location selected by local agencies
- Taught by recognized experts approved by NCPP
- Participants received CEUs from Michigan State University

- Fosters technology transfers between academia, industry, and agencies
- Agencies understand and accept preservation treatments




