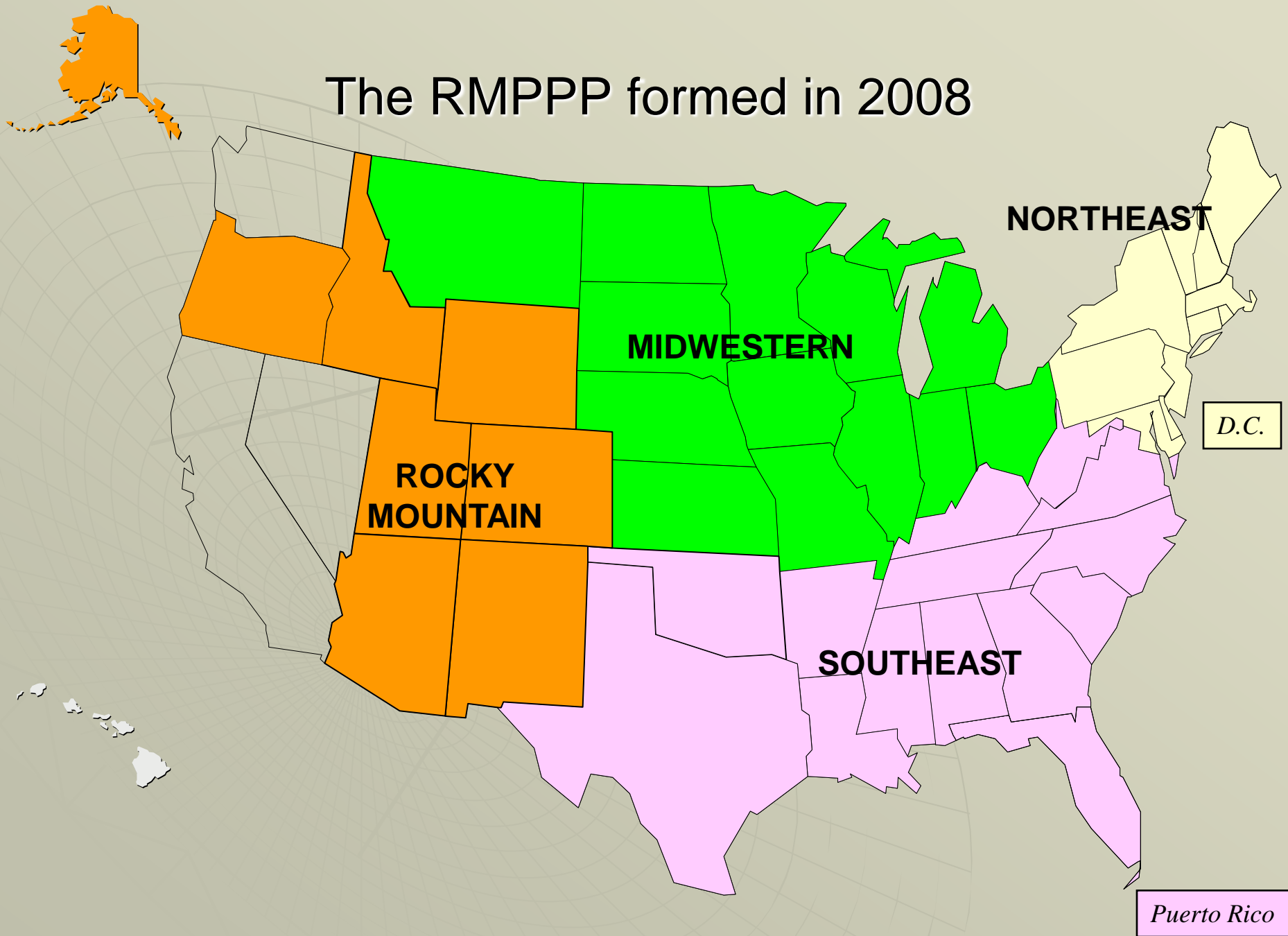
What are Pavement Preservation Partnerships?

- ◆ A collaborative effort comprised of pavement preservation professionals including state public officials and agencies; local and federal government officials and organizations; private agencies, contractors; suppliers; and academia with a common purpose to improve and promote the benefits of pavement preservation. (*Rocky Mountain PPP Vision Statement*)

Background behind the PPPs

- ◆ An initiative of AASHTO's Transportation System Preservation Technical Services Program (TSP²)
- ◆ Primary funding by states' voluntary annual contributions to the TSP²
 - \$9500 supports TSP² pavement preservation activities
 - ◆ \$3500 supports PPP annual meetings, including travel to the annual meeting for 2 representatives of each member state
 - \$10,500 supports TSP² bridge preservation activities
- ◆ Staff Support provided by the NCPP

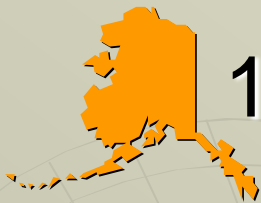
The RMPPP formed in 2008



RMPPP Organizational Kickoff Meeting April 2008, Denver, CO



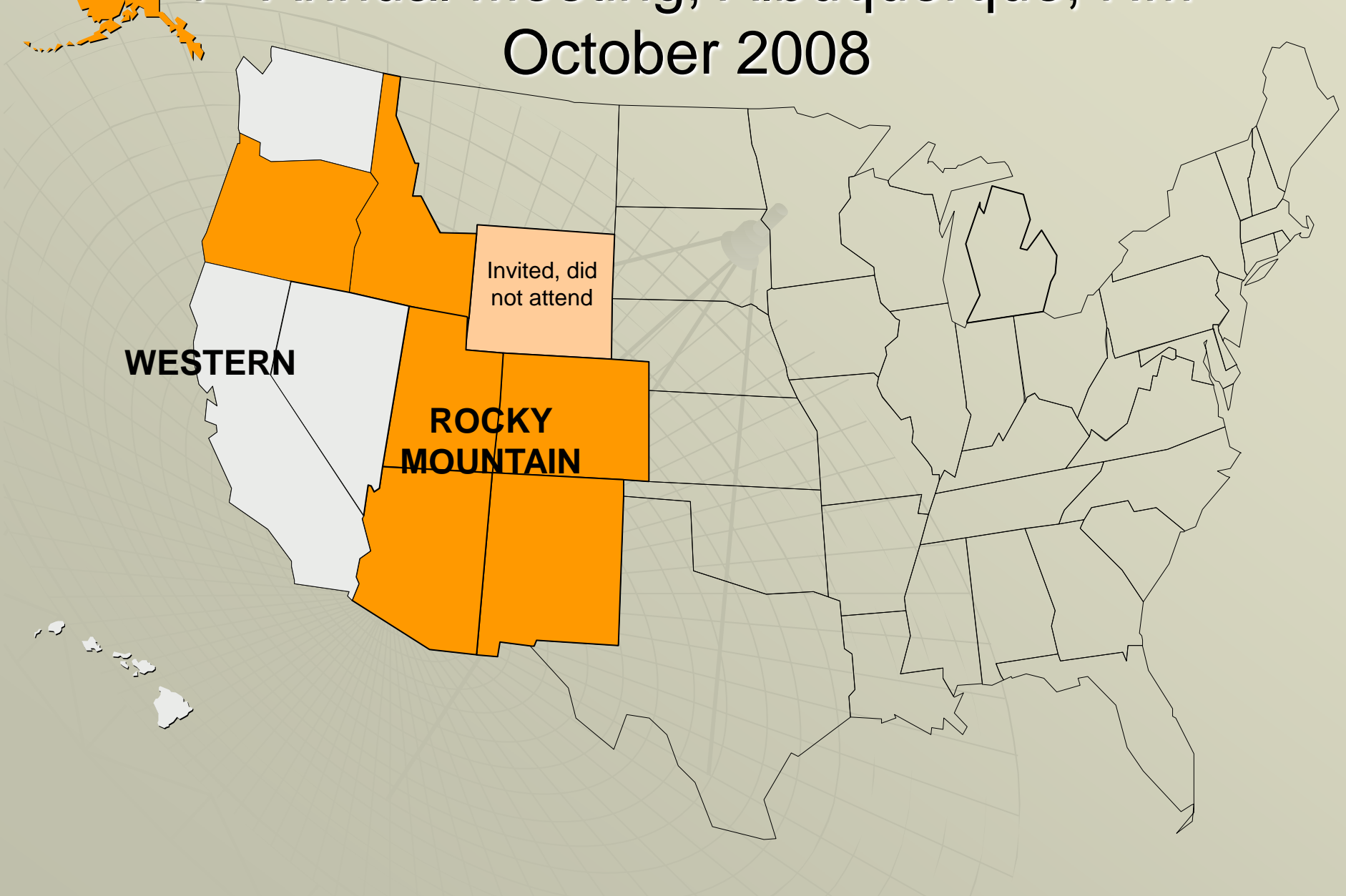

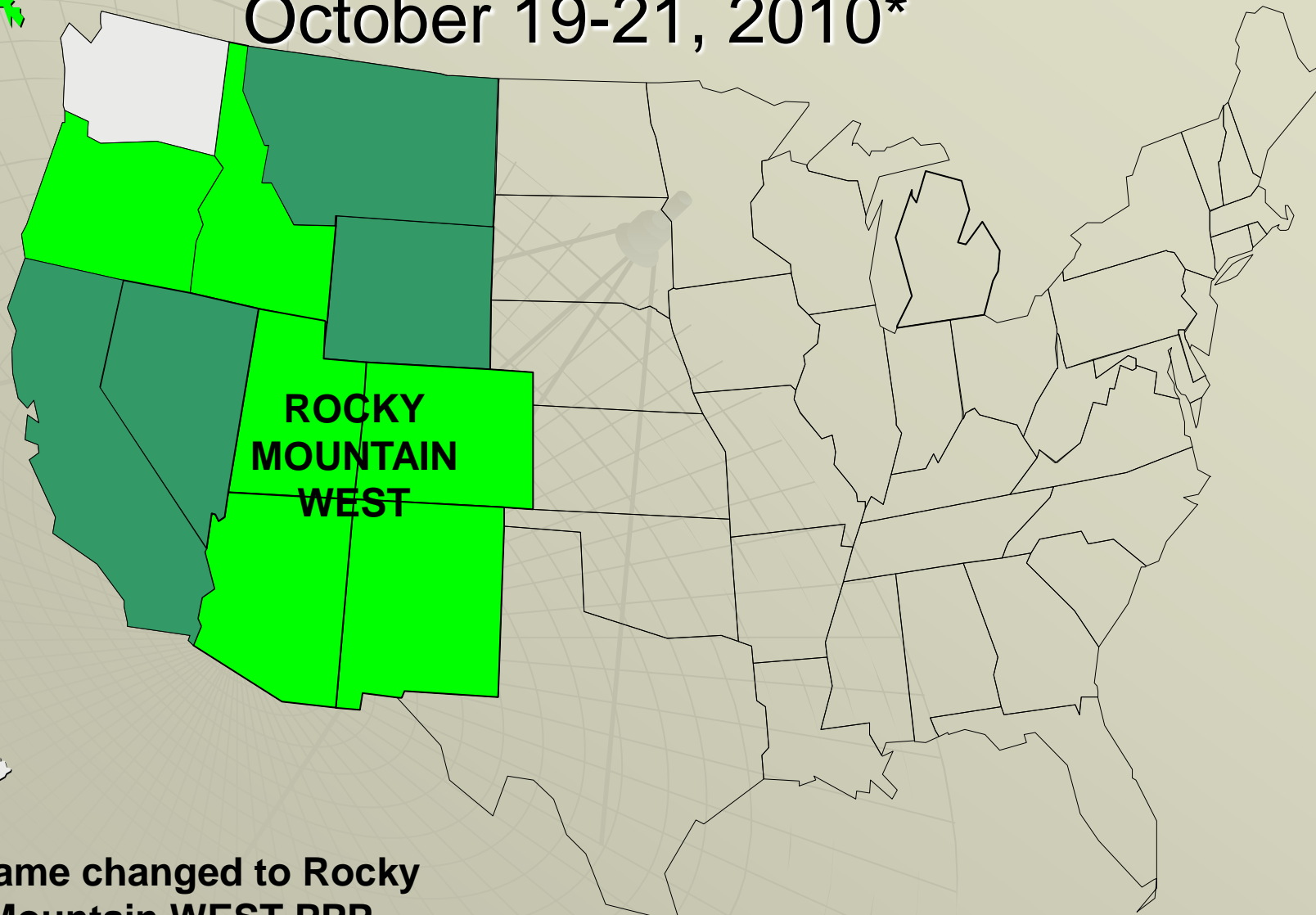
