 - Senate Bill S.1193 "Federal-Aid Highway Preservation and Renewal Program Act of 2011"



2011 Priorities

- SAFETEA-LU reauthorization
 - **Expires March 31, 2012**
- Update as of October 3
 - House Bill (Transportation and Infrastructure)
 - 6 year bill/\$15-20 B yearly shortfall at current levels
 - Senate Bill (Environmental & Public Works)
 - 2 year bill/\$B yearly shortfall at current levels
 - Senate Bill S.1193 "Federal-Aid Highway
 Preservation and Renewal Program Act of 2011"
