#### ☐ Issue Statements/Briefings

- Metrics s/b general to allow for wide application and accommodate state reporting requirements
- Stop light approach
- DOTs to develop methodology for metrics reporting based upon approved national parameters
- o DOTs need to be able to retrieve specific metric detail to make assessments
- Encourage benchmarking and sharing of best practices amongst DOTs

#### □ Adopt four recommended national metrics?

- Recommend/define a standard for each metric
- Provide any limitations in regards to compiling and reporting metrics

#### □ Review/Approval Process

- Through EMTSP, organize a committee to discuss metric standards, limitations, and consideration of future metrics
- Committee to review, assess, and make final recommendation for performance metrics.
- Committee will recommend a timeline for metric implementation.
- Final metric(s) presented to EMTSP members for review/acceptance.
